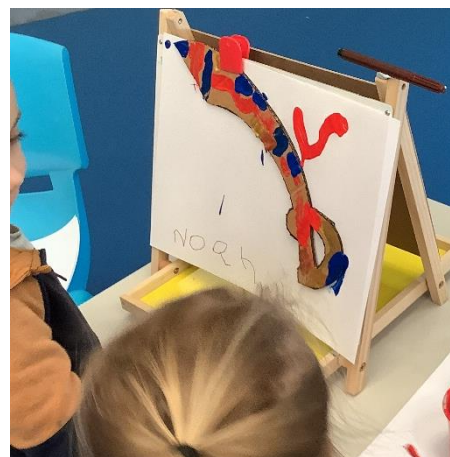




Week 2 – Dress Up Theme – Pirates
