



Activity Consent Form – Year 4 Living History: First Fleet Incursion (MD, ME, MF)

6 May 2021

Dear Parent/Carer

On **Tuesday 1st June**, Year 4 students will be involved in a full day incursion called “Living History: First Fleet”.

During Term 2 and Term 3, for both HASS and English, students will be required to describe the plight of the convicts on the First Fleet and first contact, for their assessment tasks. This HASS and English cross-curriculum incursion will assist students understanding the problems in England which lead to the transportation of convicts on the First Fleet, life on board during the voyage, and then further explain the unique challenges and experiences facing the convicts and soldiers upon their arrival in New South Wales.

Activity Details

On **Tuesday 1st June**, Year 4 will be partaking in a full day incursion. This activity will be based in the school Hall, with some activities outside the Hall.

This full activity day will include;

- a 2 hour drama presentation
- time for students to interact with props, costumes and artefacts from the era
- traditional activities, games and dances that were common for children during the early Australian settlement period.
- Risk level is low.
- All Year 4 teachers will be supervising in conjunction with the Living History supervisors.

Dress Code is school uniform. Hats and/or water bottles will be expected for outdoor games.

Activity Cost: \$17.50 per student

Kurwongbah State School is a cashless school. Preferred payment method is BPOINT (using the BPOINT link on the invoice emailed to you). Payment can also be made by QParents, EFTPOS or Cheque/Money Order (payable to Kurwongbah State School). **Payment must be made by Tuesday 25th May, 2021. No late payments can be accepted.**

Refund Guidelines for Activities:

At Kurwongbah State School we are committed to providing a safe and supportive learning environment for students, staff and volunteers. This commitment includes the health and safety of staff and students when conducting curriculum activities in the school or in other locations.

School excursions and camps enhance a student's learning by providing opportunities for the student to participate in activities, both curriculum-related and recreational, outside the normal school routine. All planned school excursions are approved by the Principal and endorsed by the Parents and Citizens Association.

State schools are able to charge a fee for:

- An educational service including materials and consumables not defined as instruction, administration and facilities for the education of the student;
- An education service purchased from a provider other than the school where the provider charges the school; and
- A specialised educational program.

A school fee is directed to the purpose for which it is charged.

School fees for excursions and camps are calculated on a cost recovery only basis, according to the number of students who have indicated their attendance.

Participation of students in an excursion or camp is indicated through payment of the excursion or camp fee and provision of a permission form completed by the parent/carers.

As the school budget cannot meet any shortfalls in funding for an excursion or camp due to the subsequent non-participation of a student who had previously indicated attendance of the activity, fees already paid for an excursion

or school camp may be refunded in full or in part or not at all, having regard to the associated expenses incurred and the circumstances of the non-participation.

If a parent/carer wishes to apply for a refund due to their child's non-participation in an excursion or camp activity, they may do so by completing a Request for Refund form available from the school office. Where possible, the request should include the receipt relating to the payment for which a refund is being sought.
